family. This year, our 50th home will be built! This home will be constructed as our 4th Women Build home and will be going to a very special family, the Cashondra Fenroy family.

In 2009, Cashondra and her growing family moved to Fargo. She had four children and was pregnant with twins. After leaving an abusive relationship and spending some time at the YWCA, Cashondra was able to get back on her feet and found her family an apartment. Over time, they found the apartment was not the place for a family with six children to be living. That is what brought Cashondra to Lake Agassiz Habitat for Humanity. She never thought she would be where she is now, preparing to build and own her very own home.

As the build season approaches, Cashondra and her children are anticipating an exciting summer. When asked what she was looking forward to most, Cashondra replied, "The children will have the freedom to be children." Let's join Habitat this season in bringing freedom to these families!

The Diaz family has been living in a small three-bedroom apartment for nearly 11 years. The living environment isn't very child-friendly, and the girls don't have much room to play. For sleeping arrangements the older children share a room, and the youngest

child sleeps in Robert and Sarah's room, while they sleep on the floor. "Our family is too big for our apartment," says Robert. "We need more space, and the children need more privacy."

When the new home is constructed, everyone will have their own rooms, and the children will have more areas to play and do homework. However, the added space isn't the only benefit that Robert and Sarah look forward to. "A new home will give us a much greater sense of security," says Sarah. "And it will really build our children's confidence to have something to call their own."

Moving into the new home can't come soon enough for the Diaz family. Both the parents and children are anxiously waiting for the build season to begin. "There's so much to be excited

about," says Sarah. "I'm humbled every time I drive by the site."

After 14 years together as a family, Robert and Sarah's hard work will pay off, and they'll finally achieve their dream of owning their own home. "It's such a blessing to partner with Habitat," says Robert. "This is a wonderful opportunity."

"It's an honor," adds Sarah. "We're so thankful for Habitat and all of the volunteers who will help build our home."





Upcycled Projects

Upcycled home projects have become one of the most popular ways to Do It Yourself. From repurposed light fixtures that bring new style to a room to doors that function as tables, there are so many ways to upcycle old furniture and fixtures into new and unique pieces.

That's exactly what a few staff members at ReStore have been doing. By putting some TLC into old, donated pieces, they've been able to turn them into completely new—and sellable—furnishings. All the materials used for these six projects came from ReStore—and the amount each piece cost to make may surprise you.

Upcycled Vanity

It didn't take much to give this old vanity a modern update. The vanity was sanded and painted white. Then a 2x12 piece of lumber was stained, sealed with 3 coats of polyurethane, and made into a countertop. The addition of a vessel sink and tall faucet added extra flair to this piece.

Total cost of ReStore materials (not including sink and faucet): \$30



School Door Coffee Table

The antique wood used to create this table makes it a one-of-a-kind centerpiece for a room. The old school doors used in this project previously decorated the walls in the ReStore receiving room, and a piece of early-1900s hardwood salvaged from a

deconstruction job was used for the bottom shelf. All it took to produce this unique table was some cutting, sanding, assembling and polyurethane sealing

Total cost of ReStore materials: \$35



Window Coffee Table

This coffee table doubles as a functional storage space. An old window from a salvage deconstruction job was used, as was the same 1900s hardwood used in the school door coffee table. 4 spindles were cut down for the legs and the outside of the table was painted white. Then hinges were attached to the inside of the table so the window top could be opened, creating a great space for storage.

Total cost of ReStore materials: \$20



Console TV Shelf

There's no need to throw out an ancient console TV when you can make it functional! The insides of this old Zenith console TV were taken out and replaced with a middle shelf and a piece of wainscot on the back. The outside was

painted Cool Breeze Blue and the inside was painted white.

Total cost of ReStore materials: \$20



Upcycled Light Fixture

Transforming an old light fixture into a more contemporary piece can completely change the look of a room—and it was a really simple project for the ReStore staff. This fixture was spray painted with metal paint. Then the globes were replaced with more modern ones from ReStore. Done!

Total cost of ReStore materials: \$10
